

UCI ATHLETES' COMMISSION - ROAD REPRESENTATIVES

Elections for the two road representatives – one man and one woman – will be held during the 2017 UCI Road World Championships taking place in Bergen (NOR).

Under the new voting system, not only will the number of athletes on the UCI Athletes' Commission increase, but there will be men-women parity across all disciplines. All representatives on the Commission will be elected for a term of four years, from the 2017 UCI Congress to the 2021 UCI Congress.

The vote will be carried out as follows:

- 19 September (14:00-18:00) Upon exit of Festplassen Mixed Zone, next to Transponder tent.
- 20 September (10:00-12:00) In Team Parking Area (Lars Gate Hill) near Medical Tent
- 20 September (13:00-18:00) Upon exit of Mt Floyen Mixed Zone, next to Transponder tent.
- 21 September (10:00-13:30) In Team Parking Area (Lars Gate Hill) near Medical Tent

Any athletes participating in the Elite competitions at Bergen will be eligible to vote. The results of the elections will be communicated via www.uci.ch.



The organisation will provide additional cars to other nations with significant number of registered riders; These nations will be informed directly.

- Collection of vehicles: from Thursday, 14 September at 09:00.
- Return of vehicles: Sunday, 24 September between 08:00 and 20:30 or Monday, 25 September between 08:00 and noon.

National Federation personnel must provide an international driving license as well as a letter from the President of the National Federation accepting liability for any costs incurred (damage to the vehicle, fines, etc.). No vehicle will be released without this letter.

OTHER INFORMATION

- The vehicles are equipped with roof racks for a minimum of 7 bikes;
- The vehicles are fitted with radio equipment that receives Radio Tour;
- The removal, modification or addition of any elements of the vehicle decor is prohibited;
- In the event of a road accident:
 - Call the emergency services on 112;
 - -Inform the manager of the race vehicles office.
- The maximum authorised rate of alcohol while driving is of 0.2 %.
- The speed limit is 80 km/h (90 km/h on motorways). Average speed when traveling in Norway does not usually exceed 60 km/h.

ROAD TOLLS

All drivers, regardless of nationality, must pay Norwegian road tolls. The automated toll stations are equipped with cameras that read the vehicle number plates. Foreign registered vehicles will be invoiced by Euro Parking Collection plc (EPC).

Register for an EPC account: It is possible to register your vehicle with EPC before you arrive in Norway. It is optional to register, however, registering for an EPC account will normally reduce the time from your journey to you receiving your invoice. Furthermore, your account will prevent the rental company from adding administration fees, and give you the ability to access your invoices, check due dates, view images, register for email delivery and make payments.

VEHICLES EXCEEDING 3.5 TONNES

All vehicles with a total permitted weight exceeding 3.5 tonnes registered to a business, government, county municipality or municipality, or which in other ways is used for business, must be equipped with a valid toll tag for all operation on public roads, linked to a current agreement for the payment of tolls in Norway.

- The tag must be linked to the vehicle's registration number by the agreement, and must be installed in the vehicle:
- The owner of the vehicle, driver or lessee is responsible for entering into an agreement and installing a toll tag;
- Violations of the order are punishable by a fine of NOK 8 000;
- The following tags are valid in Norway: AutoPASS, BroBizz from Øresund and Storebælt and AutoBizz from Scandlines.

- There will also be services at time trial start venues outside Bergen.

In the event of injury during the races, athletes will be treated (for non-emergency cases) at the Medical Centre. In emergency cases, transfers will be to Haukeland University Hospital or Bergen Legevakt, depending on severity of the injury.

ARTICLE 4 NEUTRAL SERVICE

Neutral service will be provided by SHIMANO with 4 cars and 2 motorbikes.

ARTICLE 5 TRANSPONDERS AND GPS TRANSPONDERS

Transponders will be distributed together with race numbers and recovered by Swiss Timing once the riders have crossed the finish line.

GPS holders are to be fixed under the bicycle saddle for road races and will be distributed together with race numbers. The GPS units will be issued at the rider sign-on before the start of each event and recovered by Swiss Timing once the riders have crossed the finish line.

Reminder: If a rider does not cross the finish line, the transponder and GPS equipment must be returned to the headquarters (UCI office) only. UCI Teams and National Federations will be invoiced for any equipment that is not returned (£100 for a transponder and £500 for a GPS unit).

The UCI Anti-Doping Rules apply in their entirety. Furthermore, the anti-doping legislation of Norway applies in accordance with the prevailing national laws.

The location of the doping control for each race is indicated in the special regulations

The UCI scale of penalties will solely apply.

ARTICLE 8 **EQUIPMENT AND CLOTHING**

DISC BRAKES

The use of disc brakes is allowed by all riders during the following races:

- Men Elite and Women Elite Team Time Trials;
- Men Elite, Women Elite and Men Under-23 Individual Time Trials;
- Men Elite, Women Elite and Men Under-23 Road Races.

The use of disc brakes is prohibited during the following races:

- Men Junior and Women Junior Individual Time Trials;
- Men Junior and Women Junior Road Races.

JERSEYS AND DISTINCTIVE SIGNS

It is compulsory for all riders to wear their national team clothing (identical jersey and shorts for all riders) (except in UCI Team Time Trials).

World, Continental and National Champions must wear national team clothing that does not feature any distinctive bands on the sleeves or shorts (except in UCI Team Time Trials).

Furthermore, as the World title is at stake, it is strictly forbidden for any rider to use not only the World Champion's jersey but also rainbow bands on a bicycle or clothing during the UCI Road World Championships (including UCI Team Time Trials).

The sport directors of national teams must submit their national iersey and shorts to the Commissaires' Panel for approval during the confirmation of star-ters. They must describe the panels on the clothing approved by the National Federation for the use of each rider's sponsors.

PODIUM CEREMONIES

All podium ceremonies will take place immediately after the finish of the event. The organisation will provide an escort to guide the riders to the podium ceremony area without delay.

The World Champion and the second and third-placed riders must present themselves for the podium ceremony within 10 minutes of the finish of the event. This requirement also applies to the World Champion team, and second and third-placed teams, in the UCI Team Time Trials.

Riders must present themselves in race clothing, wearing their national jersey (or trade team jersey for Team Time Trials) and shall not wear a cap, headband, glasses or any other accessory until they leave the podium ceremony area.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNIQUES AND RESULTS

Results will be available at www.uci.ch after each race and communiques will be sent by email to the sports directors of each team.

Teams may also collect printed versions of the communiques and results at race headquarters.






ACCESS TO THE START FROM BERGEN TO ASKOY

ARTICLE 4 START ORDER

All bikes will be checked using a measuring jig that complies with UCI Regulations. Once checked, bikes will not be allowed outside the start area. A pre-check of bikes will be organised two hours before the first team starts in each of the events. Teams may present their bikes for checking at this time.

ARTICLE 6 FOLLOWING VEHICLES

Each team will be allowed to follow their riders in a maximum of two team vehicles, accredited by the organisation, providing technical assistance if necessary. Feeding from a following vehicle is prohibited.

ARTICLE 7 INTERMEDIATE TIMES

Intermediate timing points will be set up at different locations on the course. Times will be communicated by Radio Tour. The finish time will be taken on the 4th rider of each team.

ARTICLE 8 HOT SEAT AND PODIUM CEREMONY

HOT SEAT

For the benefit of the TV production, a Hot Seat will accommodate the team that has set the best provisional time.

The Hot Seat will be located in the finish area along the finishing straight. Immediately after they have finished, the team having established the best provisional time is guided to the Hot Seat by an escort provided by the organisation.

As soon as a new best time is set, the team gives up its place to the new team at the top of the provisional standings.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.

PODIUM CEREMONY

A podium ceremony will be held immediately after the last team of each category has crossed the finish line.



Immediately after they have finished, the riders with the best provisional times are guided to the Hot Seat by an escort provided by the organisation.

As soon as new best times are set, the riders give up their places to the new riders at the head of the provisional standings.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.

PODIUM CEREMONY

The first, second and third-placed riders in each event attend the podium ceremony at the latest 10 minutes after the final rider of the event has crossed the finish line.




START AND FINISH VENUE - ME CATEGORY ONLY






BICYCLE EXCHANGE ZONE - ME CATEGORY ONLY

ARTICLE 4 START ORDER

The riders start at identical intervals; the riders' start order is drawn up by the UCI and communicated after the confirmation of starters.

ARTICLE 5 EQUIPMENT CHECK

Riders must attend the equipment check at least 15 minutes be-fore their start time. All bikes will be checked using a measuring jig that complies with UCI Regulations. Once checked, bikes will not be allowed outside the start area. A pre-check of bikes will be organised two hours before the first rider starts. Teams may present their bikes for checking at this time.

ARTICLE 6 TECHNICAL SERVICE

SHIMANO will provide neutral service using four cars and 2 motorbikes.

Furthermore, an extra neutral assistance will be provided by the organisation in order to provide neutral service to riders in the final climb. The details of this extra assistance will be provided during the sport directors' meeting.

ARTICLE 7 FOLLOWING VEHICLES

Each team will be allowed to follow their riders in a team vehicle and provide technical assistance if necessary. Only the vehicles provided to national teams by the Organising Committee will be allowed to follow a rider.

Team vehicles are not allowed to drive up the last 3.4 km climb; specific provisions are explained on page 35.

Feeding from a following vehicle is prohibited.

ARTICLE 8 INTERMEDIATE TIMES

Intermediate timing points will be set up at different locations on the course. Times will be communicated by Radio Tour.

The Commissaires' Panel may take the decision to stop any rider in the Bicycle exchange zone (see exact position on page 35) if they are deemed not to be riding at a competitive speed and thereby putting at risk the proper conduct of the race and/or the safety of a rider or any other intervening party.

ARTICLE 9 HOT SEAT AND PODIUM CEREMONY

HOT SEAT

For the benefit of the TV production, a Hot Seat will accommodate the three riders who have set the best provisional times. The Hot Seat will be located in the finish area along the finishing straight. Immediately after they have finished, the riders with the best provisional times are guided to the Hot Seat by an escort provided by the organisation.

As soon as new best times are set, the riders give up their places to the new riders at the head of the provisional standings.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.

PODIUM CEREMONY

The first, second and third-placed riders in each event will make themselves available for the podium ceremony immediately after the final rider of the event has crossed the finish line. The riders concerned will be escorted from the finish venue at Mount Fløyen to the podium via the funicular and then an official organisation car. Each rider will be accompanied by his chaperon and may be accompanied by a team assistant.






COURSE - ALL CATEGORIES EXCEPT MJ AND ME

TECHNICAL SERVICE AND FEEDING ZONES

SHIMANO will provide neutral service for road races using four cars and 2 motorbikes. In addition to this service, SHIMANO will provide technical assistance at a fixed point in the team pits (feed zone 1) located on "Årstadvein Road".

Teams can carry out technical assistance and change wheels and bikes at the team pits provided for this purpose.

The feeding of riders is solely authorised at specific locations around the course at times established by the UCI.

ARTICLE 5 FOLLOWING VEHICLES

Sport directors will be allowed to provide technical assistance from their team vehicles in accordance with the following arrangements:

WOMEN JUNIOR

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- 1. the vehicles of nations with five or more riders in their team;
- 2. the vehicles of nations with fewer than five riders, arranged in descending order of rider numbers. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.

Within each group, the order is determined by the most recently published UCI Women Junior Nations' Cup ranking. The order of the remaining unclassified nations is determined by drawing lots. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation on the ranking is taken into account.

UNDER-23

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- 1. the vehicles of nations with five or more riders in their team;
- 2. the vehicles of nations with fewer than five riders, arranged in descending order of rider numbers. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.

Within each group, the order is determined by the most recently published UCI Under-23 Nations' Cup ranking. The order of the remaining unclassified nations is determined by the number of UCI points in the most recently published Under-23 Continental Circuit ranking for nations. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation on the ranking is taken into account.

WOMEN ELITE

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- 1. the vehicles of nations with six or more riders in their team;
- 2. the vehicles of nations with fewer than six riders, arranged in descending order of rider numbers. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.

Within each group, the order is determined by the most recently published Women Elite nation ranking. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation is taken into account.

ARTICLE 6 TIME LIMITS

Any rider who has been dropped and lapped by the leading riders, or who is over 15 minutes behind the leading riders, may be eliminated by the commissaires and must leave the race when crossing the finish line. All other riders are included in the race classification according to their finishing position.


ARTICLE 7 PODIUM CEREMONY

The first, second and third-placed riders in the race must attend the podium ceremony at the latest 10 minutes after the first rider has crossed the finish line.

In addition, the Men Junior and Women Junior UCI Nations' Cup podium will be organised immediately after the respective ceremonies (road races) of these categories. The top three nations (all riders of the category as well as the team's sports director) must attend the podium immediately after the end of the race.





Details of the final circuit are shown on page 38.





ARTICLE 4

TECHNICAL SERVICE AND FEED ZONES

SHIMANO will provide neutral service for road races using four cars and 2 motorbikes. In addition to this service, SHIMANO will provide technical assistance at a fixed point in the team pits (feed zone 1) located on "Årstadvein Road".

Teams can carry out technical assistance and change wheels and bikes at the team pits provided for this purpose.

The feeding of riders is solely authorised at specific locations around the course at times established by the UCI.

ARTICLE 5

FOLLOWING VEHICLES

Sport directors will be allowed to provide technical assistance from their team vehicles in accordance with the following arrangements:

MEN JUNIOR

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- 1. the vehicles of nations with five or more riders in their team;
- 2. the vehicles of nations with fewer than five riders, arranged in descending order of rider numbers. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.

Within each group, the order is determined by the most recently published UCI Men Junior Nations' Cup ranking. The order of the remaining unclassified nations is determined by drawing lots. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation on the ranking is taken into account.

MEN ELITE

Each nation is allowed one vehicle in the race convoy, in the following order:

- the vehicles of nations with nine riders in their team;
- the vehicles of nations with seven or eight riders in their team;
- the vehicles of nations with fewer than seven riders, arranged in descending order of rider numbers. The groupings of nations will be communicated by the UCI after the riders' confirmation.

In each group, the order is determined by the most recently published UCI World Ranking for nations. The order of the remaining unclassified nations is then determined by the number of UCI points in the most recently published Continental Circuit ranking for nations. For vehicles representing more than one nation, the best-placed nation on the ranking is taken into account.

ARTICLE 6

TIME LIMITS

Any rider who has been dropped and lapped by the leading riders, or who is over 15 minutes behind the leading riders, may be eliminated by the commissaires and must leave the race before the circuit entry or when crossing the finish line. All other riders are included in the race classification according to their finishing position.

ARTICLE 7 PODIUM CEREMONY

The first, second and third-placed riders in the race must attend the podium ceremony at the latest 10 minutes after the first rider has crossed the finish line.

Sport directors shall inform the riders and team assistants of these arrangements.
